THE LIVE CHRIST SHARE CHRIST MISSION

We today are facing unprecedented dark times in the world and in our Church, with the rampaging culture of DEATH, growing apostasy among Catholics, 99 of the 100 sheep lost (according to Pope Francis), many lapsed and nominal Catholics, and even the enemy within the sheepfold. And so the Holy Spirit, through our Church, has called for a New Evangelization. The basic goal is to reach lapsed Catholics and bring them back securely to the fold. But how is this to be achieved? There is a need for a new wineskin that will contain the ever-creative new wine of the Holy Spirit. This is the Live Christ Share Christ (LCSC) mission. The intent of LCSC is to mainstream Catholic lay evangelization.

There are four basic aspects. First, evangelization. This is the proclamation of the good news of salvation in Jesus. Our Church is a missionary Church, commissioned by Jesus to make disciples of all nations. But while our Church is very busy with its many ministries and programs, this aspect is being neglected. We need to return to the core work of our Church.

Second, lay. The lay people have been called the sleeping giant. It has to be awakened and empowered. There is a need for more workers for the harvest. Lay people need to realize their dignity and call as Christians, to participate in the ministry of Jesus as priest, prophet and king.

Third, Catholic. We look to the revival and renewal of our Catholic Church, which is the one true Church established by Jesus himself. One-third of the world's population is Christian, and half of that is Catholic. But most are lapsed or nominal. They need to be brought back to authentic Christian faith and to be renewed in the Spirit.

Fourth, mainstream. The major focus needs to be evangelization. All the other programs, activities and ministries are important, but the thread that should hold everything together is evangelization. This work should be a conscious and deliberate effort of all parishes.

What needs to happen to every Catholic? Catholics need to meet Christ, to live Christ and to share Christ. To meet Christ is to enter into a deep personal relationship with Jesus as Savior and Lord. It is to encounter Jesus as friend and companion. It is to put one's faith, hope and trust in Him. It is to center one's life on Jesus.

To live Christ is not just to be a good person, but this is a call to holiness and discipleship. We are called to be holy as God is holy, and to strive for Christian perfection. We are to be authentic disciples, which necessitates self-denial, embrace of the cross, and following Jesus. To share Christ is to participate in the work of evangelization, by our personal witness and by our going off on mission. We are witnesses to Christ. We are those who are sent. Most lay Catholics would do this in their dayto-day environments, in the home, in the workplace, with relatives, with friends, with co-workers, and in every other situation we find ourselves in.

All the above can be accomplished in and through LCSC.

THE CALL TO EVANGELIZATION

The recently conducted 'Ignite' Conference which was focused on bringing the message of the Gospel through the New Evangelization was an eye-opener for the community and our work in the salvation of souls. This is because there are many Catholics who are drifting away from the Church as was highlighted by Frank Padilla, our Servant General, in his opening remarks at the conference.

Indeed, the current evangelization work being done does not do justice to the number of people who are being drawn away from the faith. Evangelization is the need of the hour. There is a need for a vibrant and evangelization method that reflects the fervour of Pentecost. We must look to the apostles to truly understand the power and anointing of the Holy Spirit and his pivotal role in the process of evangelization. The Church has in many ways been distracted from the mission that Christ himself entrusted us within Mt 28:19. This was His final instruction to us to go make disciples of all nations.



We must realize that the burden of evangelization does not lie solely on the shoulders of the priests and religious. The laity is called to participate and engage as many

people in this new evangelization. We (the laity) need to help the lost find their way back to God and subsequently become true discipled Christians. We need to help the ones who have strayed away to meet, live, and share Christ. Those of us who are already part of a community are learning to know Christ intimately and live in His ways, striving to be perfect just as the heavenly Father is perfect. However, we cannot stop there. It is equally important for us to share Christ, it will be selfish of us to not share Him and His gospel with everyone around us. We can share Christ through all the cutting-edge methods available to us in our times.

Live Christ, Share Christ (LCSC) is one such method formulated by the M i s s i o n a r y Families of Christ in response to this call. LCSC contains within it programs and modules that



reach out to different segments within parishes and other communities. Through it, we can engage and nurture our young Catholics to defend and live out the mission of Christ by the programs like 'Live Pure' and 'Live Life'. We can use the pillars available to us like 'Live Word' and 'Live Full'. Live Word is a Liturgical Bible Study (LBS) program where we can evangelize through the word of God.

'No one in Need' is an initiative that is undertaken to reach out to the poor as part of the 'Live Full' Program. While this initiative primarily caters to the physical needs of the poor, the program also targets their spiritual needs as well.

The community has responded to this call to Live and Share Christ through the various outreach programs



FOUR PILLARS

LIVE PURE: Live Pure is a movement for chastity for the youth. Young people are helped to strive for purity of mind, eyes, speech and body, as they live out the values of human dignity, relationships, waiting and love.

LIVE THE WORD: Live the Word is a program that promotes the Liturgical Bible Study method of appreciating and studying the scriptures. It is a practical method of doing Bible study in small groups, as well as in the family setting.

LIVE LIFE: Live Life is advocacy for faith, family and life. It staunchly opposes reproductive health forces that promote a culture of death.

LIVE FULL: Live Full is about building the Church of the Poor. This work looks to building parish-based communities through holistic development, providing shelter, health, education, livelihood and values.

that have been conducted. We have reached out to parishes in urban as well as rural areas, particularly farflung areas in the East and North-East of India, to assist them in renewing the lives of the parishioners and building up their family life. Campus outreach programs have been another way of us reaching out. The young ones are at a very critical juncture of their lives and while the yearly retreats provide only a couple of days on an intense spiritual focus, it oftentimes becomes the catalyst for a life-long dedication to the Lord and an entry point for service in the parishes and covenanted communities.

The poor are always with us as the Lord reminds us in Matthew 26:11. We, as a community, respond to the hardships that the poor face, by making it a point to share our resources with them. This is particularly done through our No One in Need initiative, where we as a community make arrangements to provide in times of need especially as we have been doing during the pandemic.

As reinforced by the speakers of the Ignite Conference, the fact remains that we are at the forefront of the work to re-evangelize the ones who have forgotten that God is our loving Father and Heaven our ultimate destination. We as a community anchor the work of Live Christ, Share Christ on the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit empowers us to complete the mission Christ left us with. We must burn with passion and zeal for the New Evangelization. New evangelization is not new in its content. We are still preaching the same Gospel that the early Christians did. The New Evangelization is new only in method. We must embrace all the tools and methods available to us, to bring back to the fold all who were lost.

EVENT REPORT

STRONGER

For the first time ever, the annual MFC Singles National Conference this year, was conducted online! With the theme "Built on Rock" (Mathew 7:25).

The first session was about how our lives must be built on a firm foundation, on Jesus the Rock. When we build our lives on our careers, our families and on many other things they crumble so easily. But when our lives are built on Jesus, no winds, rains and floods will overwhelm us, because we are built strong. As the scripture says about the house build on rock, how the important decisions we make in our life also need to be centered around Jesus and how we can best serve him.

By explaining the vision of MFC the next session was to believe, live, share and bear FRUIT in the vision. FRUIT here being an acronym for Fidelity, Repentance, Unity, Integrity and Transformation. As he elaborated on FRUIT, the first one of Fidelity means being committed to all community meetings and making time to attend them. Repentance means to overcome our areas of sin and grow in holiness. Unity means being fully united with God which gives us the grace to love, understand and encourage each other. Integrity involves us being men and women of our word, be people who seek and live by truth alone and reflect Christ. The last aspect of Transformation is constantly transforming our lives to do what is good and continue to draw closer to Jesus as we improve in different areas of our lives.



SESSION BY CRISTABELLE

The third session was how not to be like one who hears the word of God and does not act upon it (life built on SAND), but to be like one who hears the word of God and acts upon it (life built on ROCK). The acronyms of SAND and ROCK were elaborated to explain the

parable. S in SAND stood for selfishness, where we may be choosing a life that is pleasing only to us. We need to more conscious of the needs of others, and above all, have a mind of service. A was for Anger, a strong emotion that can break our ties with God as well as with others and in brings with it disunity. N was for Negative Speech which involves gossip, criticism or use of foul language. D is for disobedience where we choose to select certain teachings of the teaching and ignore the others, not obeying the instructions from leaders in the community, disobedience to the commandments and not working on our area of sin. We have to follow ROCK where R stood for **Remain in Him**, which means we stand with Jesus no matter what we are going through in life. O was for **Obedience**, we are called to obey completely not partially, and obey out of love. C is for **Carrying your cross**, to carry our cross without complaining with the conviction that Jesus is with you as you bear it. The last point of K is for **Kindling Kindness**, which means being patient and love those whom we find difficult to love. It is a decision that we take as a disciple of God.

The last talk of the Conference stressed on how the mission of Christ is urgent and we must heed this call without delay. The speaker shared how our Christian values have been diluted or even dissolved in our current society. And we need to be Holy Warriors who stand up for our faith. Citing the example of Joshua from the scripture, he explained our qualifications don't matter because God does not call the qualified but he qualifies the called. Based on this he shared 5 Fs of being a Holy Warrior. The first one is to be Founded on Christ, to be rooted in Christ and be sanctified in him through our prayer time, rosary, time in adoration and imitating saints. Secondly, we need to be Faithful which means being faithful to living a life in Christ and use our talents to glorify God. The third F is to be **Fully** Committed, to show commitment to the time we spend with God. The next F is to be Fearless, to do what God wants you to do knowing that He's in control. It means leaning on God's strength even when we don't feel equipped to do the task.

The sessions left all of us enriched with knowledge and empowered in Spirit to grow as a Holy Warrior in Christ and build our lives on Jesus the Rock.


those special date nights, the extra time we took for


Catechism of the Catholic Church Sessions


