# **LIVE PURE MOVEMENT**

Today's society, particularly the youth, are heavily influenced by liberal ideas. The Catholic understanding of love, sex, relationships, and purity have been gravely misshapen by the media, creating a consciousness that is, in one way or another, void of true Christian value. With the surge of Western ideas creeping into our youth pop culture (by way of the digital era), it suddenly became widely accepted among young people to rush into all sorts of intimacy with the opposite sex. The media has portrayed pornography, self-abuse and premarital sex as liberating, fulfilling and without negative consequences. This debases the true value of sex and promotes a sexually promiscuous lifestyle. It also leads to a misunderstanding of how youth should get along with the opposite sex.

These values are being corrupted in almost every institution (family, school, friends etc.) that we are a part of. The grounds of morality are becoming loose every single day. The idea that pornography, contraception, abortion and premarital sex are acceptable causes great confusion among the youth one way or another.

We, as a Catholic movement with two sections that cater to young people realize that being passive about this will not help lives that are confused and battered with the wrong message. It is a daunting task to challenge this twisted landscape no matter how menacing the current realities are. There is a need to bring forth to everyone God's view and intended purposes for love and sexuality.

It is a call to live pure. We realize that this is a calling that goes beyond membership to a community for it is intrinsic to Catholics across the country to be sons and daughters of God. That living a pure lifestyle is our way to holiness. The response of the MFC Community to this mission is found in the LIVE PURE MOVEMENT.



The mission statement of the movements states: "We are pro-life advocates striving for purity of mind, eyes, speech and body. We commit to share our conviction by giving young people opportunities to realize and live out the value of human dignity and fraternal relationships" and the following are the objectives of the movement:

- •To promote a Live Pure lifestyle among the youth today.
- •To bring the cause of Live Pure to Parishes, High Schools, Colleges and Universities through Live Pure formation sessions, workshops and events.
- •To start a world-wide movement enjoining young men and women standing and living up for the cause of chastity and purity.

The programs within Live Pure are offered to parishes by the MFC community, working with the existing youth structures to implement them. These programs include

### **The Chastity Forum**



The Chastity forum is the first stage of the Live Pure series. It discusses human sexuality first since that is crucial to cover before delving into the issues of today's youth. As one understands his/her uniqueness as a man/woman, he/she would gain deeper knowledge and wisdom on how our sexuality works perfectly with God's plan.

This forum equips participants with the right information about teen sexuality that focuses on being pure and chaste before God's eyes. This is the aim of the said forum – to promote saved sex rather than safe sex.

As statistics indicate, we are now living in a sex-crazed environment. Therefore, it is necessary that all young

people, in the form of teaching and formation, be educated on the real deal of human sexuality. It is important to promote the direction of chastity and purity, while training young minds altogether on pertinent sex issues of today.

### Men's and Women's Forum



An important goal is to build among young people everywhere genuine brotherhood and sisterhood. As iron sharpens iron, brother to brother and sister to sister is

how youth build up their true selves attuned to the men and women that God wants us to become. The aim is to foster a system of deep friendships anchored on loyalty, accountability, and mutual respect. To achieve this, we have the "Real Men, Guard Your Heart" and "Redefining Beautiful" sessions. These aim at guiding the youth how to be men and women after God's own heart. It is in the theme of brotherhood and sisterhood that the call to get on the road to righteousness/holiness is instilled over and over again.

#### **Love Forum**

In this session, young men and women are informed of misconceptions about love as translated by the world and media today, and how



genuine love should be based on Scripture. Also provided in this session are the practical tips young people can live by waiting for true love and as they decide to "become the one" rather than to "find the one."

#### **Live Pure Retreat**

This retreat is designed for youth and young adults focusing on the message of true love, chastity and purity, with the heart of its message stemming from our longings fulfilled in Christ in the <u>Eucharist</u>. To relay the message that chastity is about saying "YES" to the greater good, the pearl of great price, the TRUE Banquet! It is accepting a life of FREEDOM, a life of ABUNDANCE, a

life that is full. It is choosing Christ. And doing so, we are saying no to the counterfeits, no to the lies, no to empty promises that this world has to offer.



Each of these programs inculcates in the participants specific attitudes and leads them to make decisions in their life that is consistent with

the Church's teaching on pro-life, purity and chastity. Participants are encouraged to live out the Live Pure Covenant that states that as we are created in the image and likeness of God, we must live out greatness and holiness by striving to imitate Christ and his purity. The Covenant of Live Pure reads as follows:

I am created in God's image and likeness; hence, I will live out His greatness and holiness by striving to imitate Christ and his purity. I commit to practice the virtue of chastity and observe self-control over my passions and desires.

**I WILL FREE MY MIND.** I will keep my mind clean from impure and lustful thoughts. I will keep my eyes away from pornography, as it degrades me.

I WILL SPEAK WITH GRACE. My speech will be gracious at all times. I will not tell or laugh at green jokes, nor share and listen to stories which evoke sexual thoughts and behavior.

**I WILL BE CHASTE**. I will treat my body for what it truly is – the temple of the Holy Spirit. I will not engage in masturbation, fornication or homosexual acts.

**I WILL LOVE TRULY**. I will become a man/ woman after God's own heart, that I may learn to love purely. I will make a gift of myself in whichever vocation God will call me to. I will keep my relationships pure.

I am called to lead a chaste life -- whoever I am, whatever I do, whatever they say and wherever I may be.

We look forward to working with Parishes across the country to initiate the Live Pure Movement and build men and women for the future, hearts firmly focused on Christ, and filled with a love that is pure and holy.

# **LIVE PURE RETREAT- NEW DELHI**

The MFC Singles-Gurgaon were invited to conduct the Live Pure Program as the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Retreat of St.



Francis de Sales High School, Janakpuri, New Delhi from December 28-30, 2020 for the purpose of reconnecting the students of classes 9-12 with the essential truths of who we are as sons and daughters of God and what is God's plan for our sexuality in comparison to what the world influences us to believe.

Today's youth live in a world where the true value of sex and sexuality have been debased and distorted by media. Hence, many young people are lost, confused or misinformed when it comes to answering life's deepest questions. In order to become the men and women God designed us to be, it is important for every young person to discover their original design and their call to live a pure and chaste life.

This is quite the challenge, along with the given the COVID restrictions, these topics were discussed on an online platform, as opposed to in person where deeper connections can be made with the youth. It was precisely why we were greatly impressed by over 130 students who voluntarily registered for this program even though they have the pressure of online classes, board exam preparations and online tuitions to fit into their tight schedule. You can easily see the great hunger for this subject among the youth, even if their attitude may just be sceptical towards the Godly perspective, their presence and attention is all you need for the Holy



Spirit to start work.

The program was designed around the Christmas theme with Santa Claus and Rudolf as the master of chancellors. Santa played by Rahul Gosh and Rudolf played by Anahita Ray, eased the flow of the day's events with fun games and activities that kept the gathering in knots with their witty banters. This was followed by a soulful time of praise and worship led by Clive Mario D'souza on the first day, then Basil Cardoza on the second, and David De Melo on the last day. This set the mood for prayer and contemplation where each of them prayed for the opening of hearts and minds for the grace of God to guide all through this program and onward.


The first talk was a short introduction on Chastity. A word that is often associated with superficial ideas like wearing decent clothes and having acceptable behavioural conduct in social circles, but actually has so much more to offer us in our strive for holiness and in building strong sense of self-worth, as we look at ourselves through the eyes of God. Aaron Gomes from Goa discussed some interesting points that aided the participants to understand and appreciate God's original plan and design for human sexuality. The objective of his talk was to inspire and convict the young people to choose to live a life of chastity and purity. Drawing from his own experiences, Aaron was able to bring out the concept with clarity, giving hope to the young people, that through chastity, we can experience true freedom, total happiness and true love.



The second day we had separate talks in the men's and women's forum each conducted by Jared D'lima and

Elricia Mascarenhas respectively. It's important for the youth to understand the equally significant roles that both genders play in the society. The men are the ones who lead the family which is the most basic unit of the society. It is very important that every man lead a life worth emulating because they become role models and guide for the future generations. The women need to recognise that they are the crown of creation not an after-thought of God once he created Adam. Many times, women feel rejected and forgotten in society, because of which they also easily forget their true value in the eyes of God. Instead they adopt the beliefs and definitions of womanhood by the world rather than of God.

The world will lead us astray but God will reveal to us the truth of who we are, that we are His beloved sons and daughters. In these forums, Basil Cardoza, Anahita Ray and Joanne Santy shared their testimonies of brokenness and renewal, and how they continue to trust and obey God in times of temptations.



For the last session of the program, we invited Basil Rodrigues from Goa to give the talk on 'Love and Dating'. Any talk about love and the dating life is one that gets us all on the edge of our seats. Love indeed is a beautiful thing, but most of the time this may also cause hurt when we approach dating relationships at the wrong time and for the wrong purposes. It's important for the youth to understand the true purpose of dating i.e. to

find a spouse, and that we should not fall under the worldly pressures of entering a dating relationship when we are not ready for marriage. Beverly De Souza shared how she never settled in her standards and boundaries of purity while dating, which is how she eventually found and married a man who loves, honours and respects her as his bride.

All these experiences of repair, hope and restoration was opening the minds of the young people. Over the course of the retreat we encouraged them to send in any questions they may want us to discuss further via a Google Form. These questions were addressed in an Open Forum on the third day where all the speakers of the last four talks we invited to have a discussion on the topics addressed.



# **GOD MY ROCK**

Faced with difficulties and situations never seen before in his lifetime, which included heartbreak, the death of family due to Covid-19 and contracting the virus himself, Brendon Mascarenhas from the Singles Section shares how he was led to the rock that is our loving Father.

For as long as I can remember, I, like most people, built my life upon my career and relationships. And during my early twenties, the status quo for a great career was earning an MBA; so I followed the band wagon and focused on getting into a top B- school too. For months I studied extremely hard and kept scoring a 99 percentile in my CAT mocks, but when the exam came, my nerves got the best of me and I floundered big time. Just like that my dreams of getting into a top tier MBA program came crashing down, and that's when I turned all my attention to the other most important thing to me - my relationship with my then girlfriend. She meant the world to me, she wasn't just in my life to compensate for my lost professional dreams, but she was my dream. However, during year 6 of our relationship, she broke up with me, and that's when I hit rock bottom. During that time of utter loneliness and poor decision making, I told myself that I could only count on my family for love, for only their love would never cease. So I turned to my most loving family member - my dad. He was the kindest person I knew, with a 25 year track record of 100% unfailing love, so I built my life upon him. He was my rock.

In March 2020, the world went into lockdown. The first six months of the 2020 pandemic were a cakewalk for me. I had just gotten over my ex, my job was stable, my only brother got married, and I managed to crack a coveted finance exam. Unlike the rest of the world, I couldn't have been more grateful to God for all of my blessing. Until September, when my prayer of thanksgiving quickly turned into a desperate cry for help.

After I learned that my father and godfather contracted Covid, I took a flight back home to Goa. At first, it seemed like a regular trip-I met my folks, grabbed a fish thali, made plans to meet my friends, and all this while I just assumed that my dad and uncle would recover. And why wouldn't they? The virus was only detrimental to the old, the diseased and the frail, and papa and Uncle Oscar were far healthier than most men their age. They were going to beat this flu, so I thought. I lost my uncle on 28<sup>th</sup>

September, it was awfully quick and horrendously unimaginable. As I sat beside my dad comforting him through one failed treatment after the other, Sheldon told me that Uncle Oscar didn't make it. As I attended his funeral and watched his body forever descend to the ground, I began to weep. I realized then that the virus didn't just give the flu, but it took the lives of deeply beloved people. Through all the tears, as I grieved with uncle's wife and daughter, the dominant thought that resonated in my mind was that I couldn't let my dad meet the same fate. I just couldn't.

Back in the hospital, my dad's condition kept deteriorating, no treatment seemed to work, and the doctors couldn't give us any answers because they didn't have any themselves. As I sat beside my dad, praying for a miracle while never losing hope, I saw his oxygen levels drastically drop. The doctors told me that if it doesn't improve, he may have to be put on the ventilator. This was the most helpless moment of my life. Despite great efforts, nothing changed and the doctors surrounded the bed to begin incubating him. I asked them for more time and really pushed my dad to try to breathe. Finally, I told him, "Orlando Mascarenhas, I love you". He replied, but since he had the mask on, all I heard was "too". He meant to say "I love you too". He knew just how much I needed that reply, so he did what was right by his child even during his last breath. He never stopped being a great dad. I ran out of the ward sobbing and pinching my hand, hoping that this was just a nightmare from which I would wake up. When I came back, he was listless. Two days later he passed away.

Believe it or not, 2020 didn't stop kicking me there. I, along with the rest of my family also contracted the virus. Messages of shock and condolence poured in from friends, family, and members of my Catholic Charismatic Community- Missionary Families of Christ (MFC). When they checked in on me, I didn't know what to say. I couldn't process anything, primarily because the only person that could get me through such a loss, was unfortunately the person whom I lost. While

growing up, every time I misbehaved- recklessly splurged money, lost expensive devices, had one drink too many and acted like a complete idiot, my dad never reacted with anger. Rather, he would sort everything out as ask me, "What did you learn from this?" From the nightmare that I've been living since mid-September, I've learned that God loves a good story. A couple of weeks before losing my dad, I went to church and sensed that something grave was to happen to him. Hence, I urged him to go for confession, and praise Jesus, he did. Since the moment my dad died, the only thing that comforted me was knowing that his soul after confession was pure and that he was in heaven.

Unfortunately, this comfort was short lived. The same severity with which the virus attacked my father and godfather, it attacked my brother and me. What hurt the most was that as I laid in my hospital bed, gasping for breath, unable to sleep because my temperature see-sawed from hot to cold, was knowing that I was too physically weak to take care of my family. But, my story didn't end there, God wouldn't allow it. He never gives us a cross that we can't carry, he always sends us His helpers. Prajwal and Preetam from MFC left their families back in Bangalore, risking their health to take care of me and my family. One of the biggest pains at that time was losing my role model, but God, through these men, reminded me that though nobody could love me as much as my dad, there were many others that loved me a whole lot. And therein my healing process began- by being grateful for what I had, rather than what I lost.

I was grateful for all the people that were praying for me. Everyday a Zoom link would go out to intercede for my condition, and those prayers eventually restored my health. Though that Zoom link was originally created to pray for the petitions of my family, today, that same link circulates every week to intercede for other petitions from within MFC and beyond. This just shows how God can create good from any situation, even the darkest. I'm also grateful for my mum and the faith that she instilled in me- the faith that encouraged me to

listen to the Holy Spirit and to urge my dad to make a confession. Most of all, I'm grateful for my dad's legacy, a legacy that I wish to continue. You see, legacies aren't about how much a person was loved, it's about how much that person loved. I doubt that I'll meet anyone who will ever love me as much as my dad did, but there's hope that I'll one day love someone as much as he did. But that isn't my greatest hope, my greatest hope lies in the lesson that I learned during the early days of the pandemic. Amidst that time of silence, when I was away from my friends, family and colleagues, I felt a deep call to grow my relationship with God, to build my life upon the strong foundation of His love. Looking back, this foundation prepared me for the great personal loss which was soon to come.

As much as my dad loved me, his love could never compare to the love that God the Father has for me. It's this love that gifts me the best of times, and rescues me from the worst of times. It's clear to me now, never again will I build my life upon my career goals or even my loved ones. Rather, I'll build my life upon Christ-my love, my saviour, my rock!
