If not for her maternal strength and courage, we her children would not be able to remain steadfast in pursuing the heart of her Son! LIVING THE FAITH

The tragic truth in our Church today is that many Catholics are lapsed in their faith. Even Pope Francis says that 99 of the 100 sheep are lost. Why is this the case?

Many lay Catholics do not understand the faith. They may have been born and raised as Catholics, they may have had some catechism in school, but they have not grown to a fuller and deeper appreciation of what it means to be Catholic, or for that matter, what it means to be a Christian. Thus they are easily taken by a world that is in the darkness of sin and evil, they are quick to fall to the allures of their fallen flesh, and they are susceptible to the lies of the devil.

Further, a surprising situation is that even Catholics who have gone through renewal programs (such as the Life in the Spirit Seminar) and have started to live renewed lives in Christ, are themselves not knowledgeable about the Catholic faith. They have become Christian but not necessarily fully Catholic. They have been evangelized but remain uncatechized.

But is not the important thing to know Christ and to live Christ? Yes, conversion, repentance and turning to faith in Jesus are basic. But Jesus also established the Church in order to carry on with his work. We are not called to be Christians apart from others. We are called to be part of the body of Christ on earth, which is the Church. The Church is our family, our protection, our support structure, our refuge, the instrument of sacramental grace, and the base for mission in the world.

And there is only one Church that Jesus established, founded on Peter. This is the Catholic Church, with the

Pope as the Vicar of Christ. Jesus is the only Savior, and the Catholic Church is the essential means by which people can attain to this salvation.

Aside from the reality that the Catholic Church is the only church that Jesus founded, we find in her the fullness of the Christian faith, which is so crucial for the world, especially in these times of darkness and confusion. Only we give the Blessed Virgin Mary the honor and veneration that she truly deserves. She is not only the Mother of God, she is co-Redemptrix, deeply engaged in the spiritual war that the Church herself is engaged in. We give honor and recognition to the saints, whose lives we are called to imitate, and on whom we call on for help and intercession. We have the sacraments, the channels of grace by which we are able to live truly Christian lives, in righteousness and holiness.

So all these are to say that it is of crucial importance for Catholics to know the faith, so that they can fully live it. Catholics are called to be holy as God is holy, we are called to engage in spiritual war against a powerful foe, we are called to be light to the world. All these we can do if we know the fullness of our calling, and if we rely on the body that Jesus left us in order to be of help to us.

A final word. It is of crucial importance for the shepherds over the flock to teach the fullness not just of the gospel but of the Catholic faith. They must not fall into modernism. They must guide the sheep and not mislead them.

In 1981, the Live Christ Share Christ (LCSC) programme was started with the express mission to encourage members to go forth and make disciples of the nations. In line with the Church's clarion call to new evangelisation, the Live Christ, Share Christ (LCSC) programme launched its fifth pillar-Live the Faith (LtF).

The objective is to help modern Catholics cut through the sea of misinformation and propaganda with the sword of truth. Honest, practical answers to questions of faith and providing everyday Catholics with a deeper and richer foundation of why we believe what we believe, so that armed with knowledge and powered by joy, we will all be effective ambassadors for Christ. Live the Faith will focus on Catechesis - teaching the faith and Apologetics - defending the faith and will comprise a series of specific teachings around important articles of the Catholic faith.



How can couples and young men and women stay catholic in an increasingly secular world? Can Catholics balance their faith with the demands of modern life? Enter the Live the Faith Forum - a series of talks to help people understand the catholic faith and to grow in it by embracing a Catholic lifestyle. Everytime we say the 'I Believe', do we really know what we're professing? That's where the Know The Faith Series comes in, with 6 sessions that will explain the 12 articles of the creed. Most Cradle Catholics, have received a rich legacy of

faith from our families, and the Defend the Faith apologetics series, will explain the historical and theological reasons on critical Catholic issues, so that armed with this information, we'll be able to understand for ourselves and defend our faith and principles. The 6 sessions will cover topics like:

- Defending the Faith: Our One True Church
- · The Saints: Heavenly Friends
- · Mama Mia: Knowing our Mother Mary
- The Sacraments: Connecting our Souls to Christ and His Church
- · The Eucharist: Our Food for the Journey
- · The Bible: God's Love Letter to Us

Helping breathe a new life into how we understand and live out our sacraments, the Celebrate the Faith programme offers catechesis on specific sacraments.

- For the Eucharist Blessed By the Eucharist a First Holy Communion Prep programme for Kids (along with their parents).
- · For Confirmation Activate the Power a confirmation prep programme for teens.
- For Matrimony Engaged Couples Retreat a marriage prep programme (accredited by the Church.

experience with us and how they practice the sessions in their individual lives. The first session was between Elricia Mascarenhas and Michelle Serrao. Once the session ended, Our Emcees conducted a few games for us. Day 1 ended with some virtual games which saw the chat box exploding with responses and announcements for the next day.

The second day began with the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. Fr. Noel Menezes, celebrated the mass for us. After this, a few games were held by the emcees. Mattias Menezes, from MFC Porvorim led us all into a beautiful praise and worship



session. Our first session for the day was conducted by Diana Vincent, from MFC Bangalore, who spoke about our mission, now that we have identified the dark areas in our lives and have encountered the light.

WHY APOLOGETICS?

Is Apologetics relevant in today's world?

In the current world scenario, when there are many doubts about the existence of God, when there are many versions of the 'right' path and distortions about what the Catholic Church teaches, it is very important for the laity to equip themselves with the Truths of the Faith and Scripture. Every day, the world is grappling with issues about sexuality, abortion and Catholics are questioned about their stances on these hot-button topics. Catholic understanding of the sacraments, the Real Presence in the Eucharist, veneration of the Blessed Mother and the saints has also waned and there is a need for re-catechizing the faithful and apologetics helps provide explanations for why we believe what we believe.

What inspired you to know more of the faith?

I came to a personal relationship with God in my teens and I was a part of the youth section, through the program, there used to be constant questions coming from other youth about the faith. This inspired me to find not just the answers but to deepen my understanding of the faith even further. A lot of the questions that were asked to me were questions that I had myself and I would dedicate time to find these answers so that I could help the others who were looking for the answers themselves.

As I grew deeper in my understanding of the faith I found that Catholicism has very strong reasoning that goes along with faith to explain the mysteries of life and our spiritual journeys. The wisdom of the Church Fathers, the teachings of the Magisterium and the Catechism of the Catholic Church were so enlightening that I devoted even more of my time learning them.

What are the challenges in learning about apologetics?

I think many people feel that defending the faith requires a theology degree. On the other hand, we are bombarded every day by the 'wisdom' of the world and the way Catholicism is portrayed in media that we take that for the truth, rather than find out what the actual truth is. Some Catholics themselves believe that we worship Mary or that contraception is not really condemned by the Church.

There are plenty of resources out there, but the availability of these resources are not known and

therefore not spread far and wide among Catholic communities and parishes. While the amount of knowledge to be gained is vast and can seem intimidating, one need not know everything at once, but little by little grow in an understanding of the faith through various resources available.

What are the few ways people can learn and be a witness to the faith?

First of all we must understand that all of us as Christians are called to make a defense for what we believe. 1 Peter 3:15: "Always be prepared to make a defense to any one who calls you to account for the hope that is in you, yet do it with gentleness and reverence". This is the starting point as is it a clear call for us to know what our faith teaches us. It also requires a mindset to challenge what the world has told us about what the Catholic Church teaches and to actually find out for ourselves. This is especially needed for hot-button issues like abortion, contraception or sexuality and gender issues. This also means we understand why among all professing Christian faiths, Catholicism is the one true faith.

Most importantly, as St.Peter calls out in the verse mentioned above – we must make our defense with gentleness and reverence and love. We must be gentle in communicating what we believe, not from a position of self-righteousness but in reverence to God who has revealed to us His truths that we are passing on for the salvation of souls. With this in place, we start with the scriptures, understanding the scriptures in the light of what the Church teaches, which is why I feel that every Catholic household must possess a copy of the Catechism of the Catholic Church along with the Holy Bible. Then there are websites like catholic.com, ewtn.com, ascensionpress.com, aleteia.com and prominent authors like Bishop Robert Barron, Scott Hahn, Trent Horn among several others who have books, YouTube Channels and podcasts that one can listen. While technology might sometimes cause us to drift away, many Catholics are now using it to spread and learn the Word of God and we too should take advantage to listen and watch resource people from across the World.


