FULFILLING GOD'S PLAN AT ANY STAGE OF YOUR LIFE

HISTORY OF THE HANDMAIDS

Handmaids was originally called WOMEN FOR CHRISTin Goa.

The Women for Christ in Goa began around 1992-93, when we, in Vasco, felt the need to support women in a variety of circumstances.

Basically widows who were raising children alone were facing varied difficulties and needed support in Christian living, as well as in raising their children in a Christian environment.

This support was then extended to women in other situations, too, those whose husbands were abroad, those separated for any other reason, those whose husbands could never make it to meetings due to shift work, business management, etc.

These Women got inputs at the main meetings under the CFC umbrella body, just like the Children, Youth, Young Adults and Widowers. The support for each of these groupings came in their regular weekly Household meetings, where they learnt to apply the teachings to their specific circumstances, and grow in the character of Christ, and Mama Mary.



The Women bonded together among themselves and other women in the community, through activities held in the early afternoons, in each other's homes. Here is where we prayed, made sweets, savouries, and pickled jams and snacks, in preparation for the upcoming Chapter/ All Goa

meetings, where these were served or sold, to meet the needs of the community, or those of the widows themselves.

In those days, we never bought snacks to serve at meetings, but we made them together. The surplus were sold within the community to raise funds to help the needy.

The Women for Christ helped out at all the Children, Youth and Young Adult activities, where their own children and those of others were being cared for and nurtured, spiritually, emotionally, and physically.

The women used thier talents for God's glory in numerous ways. They opened thier homes and made themselves available to serve other women and other young people without any inhibtions. It helped women trust each other with their deepest secrets and gave them support and guidance to face thier day to day challenges with God's grace.

The CFC community grew in a wholesome manner, and was recognised in the Parish and the Diocese as a harbour for those in trouble and looking for sound Christian support.

Through the day we had Three sessions by wonderful speakers who have greatly been admired for their good work and passion. The topics chosen were relatable and meaningful, giving us a deep insight on how to lead better lives.

Session I, given by Sister Stephanie D'Souza was very inspiring. She broke down the word "SHINE"-Serenity, Hope, Inspiration, New Identity & Everlasting Love - relating it with the life of St. Paul and the Samaritan women from the Bible. At the end of her talk, she left us to ponder on a question – where are we on our journey with the Lord?

The second session, "STAY IN LOVE" was remarkably explained by Sister Kim Xavier with a down to earth and refreshing point of view, lighting a spark in our thoughts. She says it is when we encounter the Lord that our journey begins; when we give ourselves entirely to Him. It's a journey of Hearts. Our life will be filled with difficulties, derailments, detours, and darkness, and God allows all of it to happen, but we should carry every burden to the Lord and He will help us work through that darkness, because His Grace is sufficient for us when we are rooted in Him.

People should see our lives, our weaknesses and through this see God's power & glory. She emphasized on the word "LIGHT" explaining how we can stay in love with the Lord. Live an authentic

life, initiate relationships, grow in humility & gratitude, heed God's command, and tune your heart to God's Heart. She spoke of Mary Magdalene's life who was a real and true disciple of our Lord.

The last session "SHINE IN LOVE" was a continuation of Sister Kim's talk, where Sister Veena Rodricks told us that the light of Christ is to be shared with everyone. We are all gifted to love and give. She made us introspect the gifts/talents God has given us and how we can use them to bring light to the people around us. It's not only our talents, but our wounds, too, that can uplift others who are distressed. The greater your darkness, the brighter your light will shine. We have to grab opportunities given to us to minister Jesus to others.



We can journey through this with a travelling companion or choose Mary & St.Joseph for companionship. We need to lead exemplary lives by being kind, caring, loving, faithful, giving and imparting blessings, goodness and happiness to all those we meet.

Toward the end of the day, we had a devout Adoration led by Sister Sonia along with the Music Ministry. This was followed by a Praise Fest with upbeat hymns which kept everyone smiling and their feet tapping.

On a closing note, we had our Country Servant, Jimmy Xavier, who was totally in awe of the program organized. He encouraged everyone to take this light forward and shine, making yourself available & significant wherever you are in His Light.

The Grand Finale was a dance by Jacinta Shabong to the song "Jump into the Light" asking us to leave our darkness behind and "Jump into the Light".

GROWING IN GRACE

One of our Handmaids shares her experience of being part of the handmaids section and how it has helped, shaped her spiritual journey.

Who are the women in the Bible/ Catholic faith who are role models for you in this ministry?

My role model is surely Mama Mary. She has always been my comfort, especially during my low and tough days. Her willingness to just trust God and say 'yes', is what inspires me and helps me to put my trust in God. Apart from Mama Mary, I would have to say Saint Veronica Giuliana. She is an inspiration through her life and the persecution and struggles she went through, but all with the perseverance and faith in God.

How being in the Handmaids ministry is helping you in your walk with God?

Being a part of the MFC Handmaids has helped me grow deeper in my faith. I'm able to share my life with like-minded and relatable Women of God, and this has helped me overcome the struggles faced at this age and time of my life. It's the loving friendship and sisterhood within the Handmaids that's helped me grow with a firmer and grounded formation.

How can this ministry help people at this stage of life?

Very often we come across people who can't really understand or get our struggles. People who can't really relate, and that proves difficult in our lives to a more happy and grateful life. However, through the Handmaids, you'll find like-minded women who are in their late 30s and above who've been through similar struggles and fears, and can walk with you, providing the right guidance, support and encouragement.

How can this ministry contribute to the church?

Ecclesiastes 4:10 says, "If one person falls, the other can reach out and help. But someone who falls alone is in real trouble."

This ministry helps toward this promise, among others. It helps us to be the workers in God's vineyard, to bring more souls closer to Him.

What are the challenges people at this stage face?

As you grow older, thoughts of not being married, will I be able to conceive, how do I adjust and progress at work, dealing with the physical body changes are just some of the challenges faced as you grow into your late 30s and ahead. And being among women who may have already been there, helps and reassures that the mountain we may see before us isn't as big as we imagined, but rather just an anthill that we need to climb leaning on God and the love of the Sisterhood we share with each other.

How is your prayer life structured (personal and communal)?

Personal prayertime is of the utmost importance and once again, through the personal testimonials heard through the women in Handmaids it testifies to how much more powerful prayer is and it just encourages me to keep at it. I always start my day with personal prayer, and on days I'm unable to spend that time in prayer, there's a feeling as though something is missing through that day. So I end my day with Scripture reading.
