RAISING A GENERATION OF SAINTS



When you see a little baby, the first thought that probably comes to mind is, "Pure Innocence!" I've had moments when I've looked at the sleeping face of my children and been struck by how angelic they appear. By the next morning we are sometimes left wondering, especially with the lockdown, how will I

ever survive parenting?

This gift, this purpose of marriage, of procreation and education of children can sometimes seem like the toughest job especially when the end is to ensure that they live lives worthy of heaven! That's pretty much what we've vowed to do when we stood at the altar and were declared husband and wife. Unfortunately, when we look around, most parents have forgotten this responsibility. It has become so much about "raising my child to just be a good person" or to have a "bright future". However, when God blessed us with this gift (as every child is) He was entrusting us to raise children for His glory, His purposes.

What does it mean to raise children for God? First it means that we, as parents, take responsibility of raising our children – we take responsibility to care for their physical, emotional, psychological and spiritual needs. This requires investing time, to understand our child, where he/ she is and to journey with them. It means we need to know what's happening in their lives and guide them in the way they understand, judge and carry out their responsibilities. It isn't enough to give them a good academic education. More importantly, we need to help them build a strong foundation in faith so that they do not get carried away by the influences of the world around them.

Pope St. Paul VI said "Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does

listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." This is so true of our children as well. You might have heard the saying "Values are not taught, they're caught." They need to see the values we talk about being lived out. When raising my own children, I've been challenged to practice the Gospel values trusting that God who is my Father and theirs will see us through. It is with joy that I can say, it has not failed!

We often leave faith and character formation to the school, catechism classes and other places where we send them to learn skills; but home is the first place they can encounter God and from there, understand themselves. It's their first taste of the supernatural life!

We can do it in the simplest of ways -

- 1. Praying the family rosary daily
- 2. Going through the Mass readings together and sometimes quizzing the kids on the texts. Kids love a good challenge!
- When they're struggling with friends, studies and other situations to pray along with them and for them.
- 4. Introduce them to the lives of the saints, who were just ordinary people but with God's grace did extraordinary things.
- 5. Talk about how we need to make the right choices and being responsible.
- 6. Setting apart time with each of our children to listen to them and sometimes just have fun.
- 7. Share a weekly meal together.

We need to be mindful of this: "Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger by the way you treat them. Rather, bring them up with the discipline and instruction that comes from the Lord." (Eph 6:4) and "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it." (Prov 22:6)

In an age where screens and gadgets seem to rule the roost, it's essential to engage kids in real ways, with real family and friends... Jesus was incarnate to be with us, to dwell in our midst, to have us experience Him. May the experience of being with Jesus draw our children to follow after Him with their whole heart!

PERSISTING IN FAITH POST-COVID

We have experienced something unprecedented in our lifetime with the COVID-19 pandemic. A small invisible microbe has wreaked havoc on our health and on our social and economic lives. For us in Missionary Families of Christ, our pattern of life has been severely disturbed. We are not able to come together for our meetings, formation programs and major events. Our evangelization has somewhat stalled. But at the same time, God has shown us ways by which we are to cope. Mainly we have used online platforms. A disadvantage is that we also have brethren who have no full access to such.

And so we look forward to when the pandemic subsides and we are able to resume our daily lives. In fact, having missed the basic necessities, we must be much more appreciative of what God has given us, and be much more enthusiastic to move forward with our life and mission.

And we know that this work is crucial. It is all about helping dispel the darkness in the world with the light of Christ. It is about reaching the lost sheep and bringing them back to the sheepfold. It is about winning souls for the Kingdom. Since the evil in the world caused God to chastise us by way of this pandemic, the way out and the way forward is repentance and turning back to faith in Jesus. This is what our work is about.

We may not expect that with the lessons of this chastisement, the world will suddenly totally turn back to God. But those who do know Him and His ways should be led to realize the disaster that awaits mankind if it persists in offending God. So it is crucial that they meet Christ, and ultimately live Christ. For that to happen, we are among those commissioned by God to share Christ. It will continue to be a long and arduous battle, but we need to persist and endure. We strive to reach as many as we can.

We have been locked down by this pandemic. There was a time too when the disciples themselves were locked down by Jesus himself. Before he ascended into heaven, Jesus told them to await the promise of the Father so that they would be clothed with power from on high. So they went to the upper room, where they locked themselves in.

The authorities today have locked us down in order to prevent us from being infected. The Authority locked the disciples down so that they would be infected, so that they would be filled with the Holy Spirit. They then infected many others and ultimately the whole world.

NOT TOO YOUNG

Children are the joy of the family and of society (Pope Benedict, General audience, St. Peter's Square, Feb. 12, 2015). They can bring happiness to a household in unimaginable ways. Their smile is contagious and their laughter can bring light to even the darkest situations. In their innocence, they are able to experience nature and God in a unique and intimate way. Hence Christ has rightly said "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." (Matthew 18:3-5)

However in this day and age, where kids are exposed to the vices of the world through many means, how can parents raise their children according to the teachings of the Church?

Recognizing the importance of leading kids to Christ from a very early stage and the struggle many parents go through to make this a reality, Missionary Families of Christ India supports it's members, children aged 12 years and below through MFC Kids India. This segment aims at teaching and guiding them towards knowing God as they grow to become God-fearing and responsible men and women.

Our activities for MFC Kids include:

Kids India Assembly: This is a once-a-month activity, usually lasts for one-and-a-half to two hours including fellowship, where kids learn more about their Catholic faith. This serves as regular spiritual nourishment for the MFC Kids India members.

Kids Village: A once-a-year state-wise gathering for MFC Kids members to discuss the theme of the community through different sessions, workshops and other fun activities.

Outreach programs for Non-MFC Kids India members:

Campus retreats: A one-time program conducted in schools for kids from classes 1st to 3rd standard (junior kids retreat) and 4th to 7th standard (senior kids retreat). Where kids are taught about different topics of the Catholic faith through action songs, games and interactive sessions.

Church Connect (Parish-Based Program): This program allows the ministry to connect to the parishes

and become partners in bringing the children closer to God. An annual retreat or monthly assembly is conducted for the kids of the parish from the ages of 4 to 12, based on discussions with the Parish Priest.




Audrey Mascarenhas, Age 11, North Bangalore

BLESSED AND BEAUTIFUL

A two-day program of spiritual self-discovery and sisterly fellowship for unmarried working singles was conducted in Bangalore and Goa on the 9th of November 2019 and 13th to 15th of March 2020 respectively.

The most beautiful aspect of the program was knowing that **Our Father loves us more than anyone else**.

I struggled to build relationships with other women because of my prejudices against them and my feelings of 'not fitting in'. Though MFC has helped me build better relations with women, this program made me realize the need for sisterhood.

I realized that I'm precious and beautiful in the eyes of our God which helped me respect and value myself just the way I was created. Such thoughtful reflections were the direct result of the female-led praise and worship, and the interactive sessions that ensured the same at the Blessed and Beautiful program.

How I view God the Father was the first question asked by the ones who conducted all the sessions. They explained that when our earthly father fails us, our heavenly Father finds us, and it is in His arms, that we find our worth and identity. The participants were then reminded that they are the crown jewels of creation and that a woman's greatest genius lies in her being receptive. Mama Mary was posed as the model of ideal receptivity as she open-heartedly embraced her call to Holiness, despite the many challenges that she encountered. The animators gently drew a light on how our brokenness keeps us from being receptive to the will



of God. They helped the participants identify their silent cries and through the group discussions that followed helped the participants pray for specific graces to combat the same.

The morning sessions were succeeded by the Holy Mass followed by lunch. The participants were encouraged to use every meal as an opportunity to get to know all their fellow sisters in the community on a deeper, albeit casual level. The next session taught the participants to travel light in life, advising them on how to avoid carrying baggage from past hurts into future endeavors. The day ended on a glamorous note. The conference room was transformed into a more free and festive space where the young ladies let their hair down and enjoyed a night of games, dance, fun, and fellowship.

The second and final day of Blessed and Beautiful commenced with the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. The participants then proceeded for a session on the 'Joys of Sisterhood', which focused on the spiritual and health benefits of hanging out with one's girlfriends. The talk highlighted how cliques and romantic relationships may sometimes distance a woman from her sisters, and it advised the participants how to confront such situations without jeopardizing any relationship. Post that, a short session on how a woman should embrace modesty was given, the participants were also given practical tips on how to dress to impress while maintaining the dignity of their body.

The final session paved the way forward by discussing



the 3 vocations that awaited the ladies on their path to Holiness. Practically discerning the call of God and trusting that His plan is better than one can even imagine for one's self was the key takeaway of the session.

The day concluded with the pray over session for each of the participants and adorning them with a crown and a pearl necklace. The ceremony reminded the participants that they were far more precious than any pearl and in the eyes of their Father that they were His phenomenal princesses.

On that profound note, the participants retreated from the venue with a deeper understanding of the Father's love, a stronger bond with their sisters in the community and a blissful assurance of being **blessed and beautiful**.

MISSION NEVER STOPS

The ongoing pandemic resulted in the community being unable to meet in person as is the usual custom, but we praise God for the gift of technology that enables us to continue our spiritual growth and community activities online.

Here's a snapshot of the initiatives that we have undertaken for the nourishment of the community as a whole and in the various sections:

SpeakLife: This initiative is to facilitate the faithful to collectively read the entire scripture (Genesis to Revelation) every day. This is done through the online portal created by our community members: speaklife.today where participants can enroll their names and will be provided scripture passages to read in order to meet the objective of reading the scriptures aloud, to declare The Way, The Truth & The Life to ourselves and to the world around especially in a time like this.

To enrich the lives of the couples within and beyond the community, Love Beyond Words has been launched as a web-series airing on YouTube and Facebook

every Saturday from May 9th. The topics are those essential to living out a fruitful and blessed family life in line with the teachings of the Holy Catholic Church. The livestreams have brought in audiences of over 2000 per video from across the country and the world.

Responding to the problem of stranded workers due to the lockdown, the community through its No One in Need ministry mobilized resources and working in cooperation with the authorities and the local parishes, reached out to 6120 families to provide kits of essential ration and supplies.



Feed the Hunger Initiative

In order to keep the spirit of worship and community in these times, the Singles section across the country have been tuning in to Let Praise Arise sessions conducted by various worship leaders from different cities live on Instagram every week.

YouCat Study Meetings

(Youth): The Youth section organized online sessions to study the YouCat which were moderated by Deacon Kevin Santis of the Archdiocese of Mumbai.

These sessions were held weekly over conference calls. The Youth Section are also participating in MFC Youth international online 'Hangout' sessions as well as workshops that have been conducted nationally.

With children being at home during this time, the kids section has been engaging parents to showcase their children's talents on social media and to join them in making action song videos for social media.

The regular teaching and household meetings have been conducted online wherever possible and individual chapters in cities have also conducted "Challenges" over social media which has brought families together to showcase their altars, dance together for action songs, take part in quizzes and so on.

The work of evangelization has also continued with Christian Life Seminars being conducted wherever possible. On the feast of



Pentecost, prayers in the form of an online night vigil was also aired on Youtube in both English and Hindi at a National level. Families from the community are also participating in the online series "Family Catechisis with Archbishop Peter"conducted by the Archdiocese of Bangalore and have greatly benefitted from it.

We praise God for the technology he has blessed us with in order to build ourselves and to reach out to more souls through the use of various media.

Missionary

The Holy Spirit is depicted as a dove, which came down on Jesus at his baptism (Mt 3:16), starting Him off on His earthly mission. In turn, Jesus imparts the Holy Spirit to His disciples, empowering them to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). The Holy Spirit is the agent of evangelization. MFC recognizes that our Church is a missionary Church, and is committed to help her attain to her destiny.

Families

We are families empowered by the Holy Spirit to help renew the face of the earth. We are committed to renew the family and to defend life. We are among those to be sent out on mission. We are families that first of all belong to Christ. The outstretched arms of Christ and the slightly inward-bent hands signify both the embrace of Jesus upon the family, and also the presenting of the family to the world, being sent forth to do mission. It is a faceless family. We become the faces of the Christian family. The family is garbed in blue, which is the color of Mama Mary.

Of Christ

Christ is of course at the very center of our logo. Our primary Core Value is being Centered on Christ. He is the be-all and end-all. We are nothing without Him. The gold ring or halo is a sacred diadem. It first of all represents a crown of royalty, and it signifies holiness, being set apart. Jesus is "the Holy One of God." (Jn 6:69).

We too are called to holiness. We are called to be like Christ, to be another Christ. We are called to Christian perfection. We are to "put on the new man, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness." (Eph 4:24). And so we have the faceless Christ. The challenge to us is to be that Christ, to be holy, to be priest, prophet and king, to love and care for our family, and to be sent forth to do God's work.
